Secretary's Report - Jim Martin

The 6th of January meeting was held at the Hunter's Den Restaurant. The turnout was 14 members (low turnout due to snow), thanks to all that showed up. The meeting was called to order by Paul Alderman at 7:20 PM.

Paul welcomed our new members from Media, PA. The Santonastaso's moved to this area from Colorado and found our Club on the internet in a search for Car Clubs and Rallying in the area. We welcomed Tony, Carrie, Noelle & Isaac and congratulated them on braving the weather to attend our meeting.

Our end of the year finances are in good shape, we have \$6,330.81 and now with our new members, our membership is 107 members.

Anita Stewart, our new Membership Chair, is going to work on developing a new program/award to recognize the member who brings in the most new members every year. She is also developing a New Membership package that will go out to all new members. As Chair, she is going to contact inactive members and those who have faded away to see what we can do to get them more involved in the Club, so don't hang up when she calls. She also asked Paul Alderman/ Shawn Dewey to help us get PayPal set up so that we can renew our memberships online. Anita and Lou Spinelli modeled their new Club T-Shirts that they ordered on our on-line store (I don't know how they did it, I was cold).

Dave Mitchell, our new Property Chair, said he is in the process of inventorying/locating our property and will report on that when he is done. He also has some ideas of things (e.g., power generator) that the Club may want to obtain that he will share in future meetings. Duke Wilford, Autocross Chair, proposed that we obtain laptops and scoring software for future events. Duke also presented a worksheet of our autox costs and income over the past year; if you want a copy, contact Duke. He recommended that we increase our entry fees this coming year to better cover our insurance & lot rental costs. This would be the first increase in a number of years and we will still be much lower than other Clubs in the area. He is working on our 2015 Autocross schedule and will present it at our next meeting.

George Alderman, our Rally Chair, headed up a lively discussion about our 2015 Rally Program. We agreed that we are going to focus as a Club on increasing the participation in our rallies; we now average about a dozen cars and would like to see that number doubled. The time and effort needed to lay out a Rally is substantial and we need to get more people to participate. This year we are going to set a Rally schedule for the year at the beginning of the year. We also need a committee to develop more Rallies that will interest a broader section of members. We are also going to have a seminar on Rallies and Autocrossing. George also presented an upcoming regional meeting by the National Motorists Association (NMA). It will be held at The America On Wheels Museum in Allentown, PA on Saturday, February 7^{th} at 12:00 PM – 2:30 PM. A group from BMC is going (details on our website).

So, after doing some internet mining, apparently this car has been shopped online for a WHILE. Photos from a finished build have a date stamp of March 2011, so the car has been in this state for almost 4 years.

Apparently, the price has been dropping since then too. The first sale price I found was listed at \$42,500. then the price drops to \$32,500 2 years later. On the builder's own website- <u>www.sheetmetalhappens.com</u> -the price has dropped to \$28,500.
