Secretary's Report - Jim Martin

The 5th of May, 2015 meeting was held at the Hunter's Den Restaurant. The turnout was 20 members and 2 guests, thanks to all that showed up. The meeting was called to order by Paul Alderman at 7:35 PM.

Our end of the April finances are \$6,581.57; our membership is 69 members for 2015, please renew your membership.

Duke Wilford (AutoX Chair) talked about our first AutoX of the season. We had 68 people show up, which is a new record (recent history) for our Club; we have not seen a number this high since the 80's. This was also our first AutoX with the new electronic equipment. We had some equipment issues that will be resolved by the next AutoX. We are implementing new procedures to speed up the registration process. South Jersey SCCA approached us to see if we wanted to co-run a 2 day AutoX in July at Atlantic City. We decided to turn down the offer due to distance and costs. Also, Mini Meet East which is planning on having a Car Show in St. Michaels, MD has asked to participate at our June AutoX. As a result, we moved our date to Sunday, June 28th. We invite everyone that wants to attend. We had a lively conversation about the number of off courses that are being experienced and can we use arrows or something else to better mark the gates. Duke said that the AutoX committee would be working on this in time for the next event. It was also mentioned that we should have more people trained in the new software scoring system (Duke scheduled a training session that was attended by one outside the family member).

George Alderman (Rally Chair) talked about the first Rally of the season (Bridges over the Brandywine) and the fun everyone had. Our next Rally will be held June 20th and the Rally Master will be Jim Martin (No pressure). It will be called the Summer Solstice Scavenger Road Rally. Details are on our website. Please come and wish me luck on my first Rally as Rally Master, positive feedback only.

Anita Steward (Membership Chair) suggested that we have copies of our Event Flyers to hand out at other events to encourage people to come to our events. Flyers will be made available on our website and can be printed out for circulation.

Dave Mitchell (Property Chair) gave a brief update on his search for porcelain Car Badges like we had back in the 60's. Let Dave know if you are interested.

Dave Back gave a Race Report on Shawn Dewey's Racing, more to follow in future Gaslines.

Bob Turner also gave an update on the Safe Driving Program, more to follow in future Gaslines.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:32 PM.



Autocross Report - Duke Wilford

Enjoying much better weather than our season opener,



a previous-record-shattering **75 cars** came to Glasgow High School for Autocross II on 16 May. Well, OK, maybe "shattering" is overstating the case a little. However, we have enjoyed steady attendance growth and we are currently about double our average

attendance from 5 years ago. It is good to see the Club's revitalization continuing to accelerate!

The course appeared to be fast and open, though we were still plagued by some off-course runs. However, it seemed to be a little easier to follow and definitely fun to drive. Many thanks to Nuri Heckrotte and David Hughes for feedback on the initial design, and for showing up early to lay it out and check drivability. Our 75 cars managed 445 runs throughout the day, for 6 competition runs each. I know David was hoping for more – maybe next time.

We are refining our check-in procedure with each event, and at the May event we processed about 50 preregistrants and 25 walkups. Registration seemed to move pretty smoothly and we were off to a much earlier start on course than at our first event. Administration will get better with each passing event as we work out system bugs and get more practiced with the new system. It also helped that so many people contacted me ahead of time to work out questions concerning car classes, etc. rather than waiting to do so at the event.

As always, we strongly encourage you to preregister at motorsportreg.com. Accurate preregistration really speeds up the on-site check-in process. Starting an account there is free, and since entry fees are not collected until the day of the event, preregistration is non-binding – you don't pay if you don't drive. We have started basic accounts for everybody who has autocrossed with us this year, so please go to motorsportreg.com and search for your email address to create a username and password.

As our events grow in attendance, we are getting shorthanded under the timing tent. David Hughes and Will McGowan (I think it was Will – Dan, if it was you, sorry) stepped into the breach by taking turns as Starter so I could manage the scoring, and both did an excellent job. At the moment we are operating with very few backup personnel, which places a lot of load on a few volunteers. On a more personal note, I would like to be able to drive one of these days, too. We are soliciting dedicated volunteers to help run the scoring system as a permanent work assignment. So if you are interested in a staff position under the tent instead of shagging cones on course, please contact me!

If you have any videos from Autocross I or II, please post them on YouTube so I can link them from BMC's channel. Alternatively, you can get them to me and I will upload them. Just search YouTube for Brandywine Motorsport Club to see past and current event videos. Pictures are always welcome on our club Facebook page as well.

Our next Autocross, AxIII, is on **Sunday, June 28** at Glasgow High School. Please note the "Sunday" part as we have adjusted the date to coincide with Mini Meet East. We will have a special "Minis Only" class as well as some Minis (and MINIs) in the open classes. We're looking forward to introducing a new batch of car enthusiasts to our favorite motorsport.

BMC is continuing our Free Rally program, with our next rally event on June 20th. We want more autocrossers to branch out into road rally! We're so sure you'll like it that **your first rally is free**. It looks to be a fun one - details on our next Rally are posted elsewhere in this newsletter.
