#### Autocross Report – Duke Wilford



Weather, drivers, volunteers, and equipment all cooperated to make AxIV one of our smoothest events to date! Saturday, 25 July came at the end of a beautiful sunny week, so the Glasgow HS lot was dry and the

surface was as good as it will get until they pass a referendum... Although temperatures were in the upper 80s, humidity and wind were low. All in all it was a near-perfect day for autocross.

This event marked our first with an attendance cap of 75. We sold out all 75 preregistrations before the event and had a short waitlist. There were some no-shows, unfortunately, but that is typical. We were able to accommodate our waitlist folks plus a few walkup entrants. We're making minor adjustments to the preregistration to allow for the usual no-shows. However, if you know in advance that you can't make an event, please go on motorsportreg.com and cancel your preregistration. That will open a slot for someone who can be there.

Because the event was fully preregistered, check-in was smooth and efficient using our new T&S system. Thanks to Maryanne, Allegheny, Elizabeth, Paul, Seth, and everyone else who helped process drivers and spectators. Also thanks to Nuri and David for setting up the course bright and early on Saturday morning.

All this efficiency meant that we returned to having 6 competition runs for the day. With an early finish, about 20 or 25 drivers also took a couple fun runs before the cones were put away. Thanks to David for lending me his car during the encore – those were the first laps I've driven this year, and in a Miata, no less. I had hoped to bring my own Miata, but last-minute mechanical problems kept it out of the grid.

Although we didn't have as many guests as last event, there were still plenty of new faces and new cars around. Lou Montella made his first BMC event this year in a red MR-S, replacing his classic MR-2. With the Caterham still under the weather, Paul Alderman drove a period-correct and stock '79 MG Midget. Chris Drabouski, a first-timer with BMC but clearly an experienced driver, showed up in a shiny new AMG Mercedes. The big white luxury car proved to be astonishingly quick, coming within a second of FTD and taking 3<sup>rd</sup> overall! Lou Spinelli lent his '66 Cobra to Erik Marcin (now there's trust for you) and opted to drive his Chevy Volt. George Alderman came out of autocross retirement to challenge Lou's electric car with his blue Toyota Prius in H Street. Maybe we need a new hybrid class?

David Hughes's blue Miata wins the Car of the Day award – it was driven in STR competition by David, Nuri Heckrotte, *and* Gerry Caceres, using as many combinations of 1s and 7s as they could tape on the side of it. Yours truly even got a few passes in it during the fun runs.

David ended up taking Fastest Time of the Day in his STR Miata, with a blistering 44.207 on his final run, followed closely by Nuri at 44.425 in the same car. Chris's white AMG posted a fast 44.989 – the only other car to dip into the 44s!

PAX told a slightly different story. Fastest Index Time of the Day was claimed by Lou Montella in his red MR-S, with an adjusted 36.932. He was followed by Steve Berrodin in a Toybaru Frizbee at 37.005 (index) and David Hughes with a 37.045 (index).

Look for our Class and PAX Championship standings to be posted at www.brandywinemotorsportclub.com. We'll be tracking multi-event results there, and will drop everybody's lowest score from the standings. That will show us who is consistently top of their class, and who gets Best PAX bragging rights at the end of the season.

Our next event, Autocross V, is scheduled for 15 August at Glasgow HS. We are still in good standing with the school district, but please remain courteous and sympathetic to the neighbors when arriving at and departing from our events. So we don't wear out our welcome, we are always looking for alternate venues! If you have any ideas or contacts with access to a large, open lot, please let me know. Scout around on your Sunday drives or weekly errands. Please keep your eyes and ears open!

At our July Club meeting, there was strong discussion about hosting the season finale at Dover Speedway. This event represents a substantial cost to the Club, because of increased lot rent and insurance requirements. We definitely hope to have AxVI at Dover because it offers a premier venue and attracts many drivers. Please consider coming to our next Club meeting (4 August at Hunter's Den near Price's Corner) and voicing your support for the Dover option.

Speaking of support, we've seen a number of regulars playing a larger role in running the events. The more trained people we have on site, the more smoothly our autocrosses go. If you would like to be involved and are interested in a specific staff position instead of shagging cones, please let me know before the next event, or during check-in.

#### Secretary's Report - Jim Martin

The 7th of July, 2015 meeting was held at the Hunter's Den Restaurant. The turnout was 17 members, thanks to all that showed up. The meeting was called to order by Paul Alderman at 7:40 PM.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> (Willis Weldin) - At the end of June, our finances were \$10,567.53 (\$8,361.38, end of May). This amount is a new high for our Club, which is a direct result of our AutoX Program. This balance includes the \$5,000 spent on new equipment.

<u>Membership Report</u> (Anita Steward) – At the end of June, our membership has grown from 94 members in May to 102 members. Last year at this time we were at 89 members. This can be tied to our renewed focus on growing the Club.

<u>AutoX Report</u> (Duke Wilford) – Our 3<sup>rd</sup> AutoX of the Season saw the attendance grow to 95 drivers. Last year at this time we had 56 drivers registered for the Glasgow Site. This is a result of a strong recruiting effort leading to The **Reisentöter Region PCA** and **Mini Meet East** Drivers attending our Event. Thanks go out to those Clubs for checking us out.

Up to this point, drivers have been able to get 6 runs in for the day; we were only able to get 5 runs in at this AutoX. As a result, we are going to limit our event to 75 cars for the Glasgow site. We had several problems surface that revolved around Track Safety:

• 2 spin outs leading to damage

• Track Workers not wearing their safety vests and not paying attention

We also had complaints from neighbors about the noise level of some cars. It should be pointed out that we lost the use of this site for over 10 years because of neighbor complaints.

We are looking at getting improved track radios and more safety vests. We also want to keep searching for at least one more site at least the size of Glasgow to provide variety for the attendees.

Our 4<sup>th</sup> AutoX of the season will be at the Glasgow site on Saturday, July 25<sup>th</sup>.

<u>**Rally Report</u>** (George Alderman) – Jim Martin reported on our  $2^{nd}$  Rally of the Season. We had 6 teams participate in the Rally. We will probably use the same route for the Braille Rally (Sunday, 10/18).</u>

Jim Irons, Rally Master for our 3<sup>rd</sup> Rally, reported that his event will be called Dealer's Choice Rally and is rescheduled to Sunday, 9/27. Entrants can chose between an Easy Tour Class or an Experienced Class (more competitive TSD).

A discussion was held on how to grab more attention to our Rally Program. Contacting people that are interested in Geocaching was mentioned as a place to start. It was suggested that we look at Ingress Apps as something to incorporate into our Rally Program. We need more ideas so we can expand our Rally Program. **Property Report** (Dave Mitchell) – We need to get a better quality battery for our track radios. That led to a discussion on getting better radios (need about 12). Also, we talked about ordering more BMC stickers to hand out at our events. "*Hoopty Do Signs*" ran off 40 of them (at no charge) and said they can provide them for 50 cents apiece (need some that we can reverse mount in windows. We have been approached by several companies that are interested in advertising with us. There was no update porcelain car badges research.

**Street Survival** (Bob Turner) - He reported on Street Survival program that is sponsored by Tire Rack and the SCCA. The Dover Air Base is interested in this program and wants to stage one on Base for Air Force Personnel. He said it would be a good way to introduce the Base to Autocrossing and other Club activities. To put the program on, he will need a number of experienced autocrossers.

<u>Editor</u> (Jim Irons) – Reminded everyone that all articles for the next newsletter need to be forwarded to him no later than Tuesday, July  $28^{th}$  (the Tuesday prior to our Monthly Meeting).

<u>Chair</u> (Paul Alderman) – Paul reminded everyone that we will be reviewing the Club's By-Laws via email over the coming month.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:55 PM.
