

#### Autocross Report – Duke Wilford



day (and night) before left the lot with a few permanent wet areas, which forced some last minute adjustments to the layout.

First, we were glad to offer the classic Minis of **Mini Meet East** a chance to try their hands at autocross, though some had clearly tried several hands at it before. After the autocross, the MME folks were headed down to St. Michael's, MD, for a multi-day social event featuring both Minis and MINIs. The event attracted about 10 classic Minis, from various Coopers to a screaming yellow (and well prepared) Mini pickup, and even a hotrodded Mini Moke, which was about as minimalist as it could be without being demoted to golf cart status.

We also welcomed the **Reisentöter Region PCA**, most of whom are no strangers to autocross or fast driving. The RTR guys are not shine-n-show Porsche owners; they drive their P-cars as intended. They have a unique autocross series where they visit other clubs' events around the region as an organized group. We were event #5 on their 2015 schedule, and we'd be glad to have them back – they always have great attitudes and look like they're having fun.

These groups helped expand our attendance to 95 cars, yet again the most we've seen in recent years. While this success makes us proud, it comes with a price. This event filled every square foot of available space at the GHS venue – paddock, grid, and course – with cars and people. Registration seemed to run pretty smoothly. We had extra help under the timing tent, too, which kept stress levels reasonable despite the size and pace of the event. Every-one seemed to have fun, whether running, working, or spectating. The large turnout and some delays meant that we only got 5 competition runs instead of our usual 6.

Speaking of delays, unfortunately, this autocross was not without incidents. In the morning heat, a driver spun at the finish line, causing minor damage to the car and to the school's property-line fence. While that served as a warning to most, in the afternoon another competitor spun much more dramatically in the same place. This car actually went through the fence, causing further damage to the fence and to the car involved. Fortunately the driver was unhurt and did not hit anything else.

This incident represents the first real accident BMC has suffered in more than 8 years. We contacted the school immediately and are working with the District to have the fence repaired to their satisfaction. However, this accident also attracted the attention of the neighboring residents, and a complaint was filed with the District office. We are addressing the damage and the complaint with the District and the residents, but further incidents like this will jeopardize or end our ability to run at the School. It is absolutely *critical* that drivers respect the environment both on campus and around the neighboring homes. Excitement runs high at an event like this, but with civilian houses located directly across the street from our venue, we must remember to keep safety our highest priority.

Toward this end, we are considering a number of adjustments to the way events are designed and managed:

• We will be capping attendance at 75 cars for Glasgow HS events. This represents a manageable size that will allow proper control over administration and safety, as well as maximizing the number of runs for all drivers.

• We will be adjusting the course layouts to reduce speeds and to stay farther away from the neighboring houses. Safety is Priority One.

• We will be enforcing noise control. Hard acceleration and braking generate loud sounds that others do not appreciate the way car enthusiasts do. Our rules have always required an effective muffler, and excessively loud cars will be parked.

I realize that this sounds like all the fun will go away, but it won't. Accidents are not fun, and losing access to our ONLY real venue will ruin *everybody's* season. Although we continue to search for additional sites, Glasgow HS is the only location we currently have permission to run. The tiny Keene lot is still available, but it belongs to the same School District. If they must remove us from one campus, they are unlikely to welcome us at another.

If you have any ideas or contacts with access to a large, open lot the size of GHS or more, please let me know. Scout around on your Sunday drives or weekly errands. We continually look for additional venues in order to provide backup for GHS, as well as some variety in location and layout. Please keep your eyes and ears open!

With attendance limited, it will be even more important to preregister for the event to secure your spot. Those who preregister will receive top priority at check-in on site. Walkup space will be limited to the spots available after all preregistrants are enrolled in the event. So, as always, please go to Motorsportreg.com and sign up before preregistration closes for our future events. Our next Autocross, AxIV, is on **Saturday, July 25** at Glasgow High School unless we announce otherwise.

As mentioned earlier, we had additional volunteers working with Timing and Scoring under the tent. We also had a good group of instructors to help point rookies in the right direction. These extra hands helped a great deal, so if you are interested in a specific staff position instead of shagging cones, please contact me.
