#### Dealer's Choice Rally

BMC's Dealer's Choice road rally on September 27th is a great chance for those who have never run a rally to try one - on us! It's free for first timers and only \$10 per car for others. You have a choice of two classes.

The **E-Z Tour Class** has easy-to-follow route instructions and just one average speed. We even give you the time of day that you should be at the instruction before each checkpoint, so you only have to run about 2 miles at 30 mph average to get a good score.

The **Classic TSD Class** also has easy-to-follow route instructions with no tricks or traps, but has various speed changes to provide a timing challenge for the more experienced rallyists.

Both classes will also have 12 questions about things encountered along the route. Each correct answer reduces your total score by 10 points. This Q&A is voluntary, but will provide a little extra fun for the navigators, along with reducing your scores.

So hook up with a driver or navigator to partner with, check the flyer in this Gasline (or on the BMC website), and email me with your class choice. I will send you the rally's General Instructions (rules & details) via email. No entry fees needed up front.

So if you're not going to Philly to see the Pope on the 27th, I hope you will come out and enjoy the Dealer's Choice rally.

#### Autocross Report - Duke Wilford



The only autocross event left in the 2015 season is our grand finale, the Lofland Memorial Autocross at Dover Speedway on 12 September. This event will not have an attendance cap, so please preregister now!

And don't forget our September 27 Dealer's Choice road rally, which is fun and free to first-timers. Details are at www.motorpsortreg.com.

Autocross V, our last Glasgow High School event this year, is in the can. Continuing our streak of favorable conditions, the weather was hot but dry, and wind was mild. August is typically our least-attended event, but we still hosted 60 drivers in a wide variety of cars, despite overlapping with some other regional events. Thanks to the moderate turnout and efficient event management, everybody got 6 competition runs, plus 3 fun runs if desired. Many – if not most – competitors took advantage of the fun run offer. Lots of drivers switched cars or brought passengers along.

The course was a little shorter than some of our recent layouts, with times ranging from the low 30s to the mid 40s. Thanks to Nuri and David for helping to design and set it up.

We continue to see many new faces at our events. We try to be a novice-friendly group, and apparently it's working. Autocross is a great way to introduce people to the car hobby and performance driving at any age. At this event we had several first timers trying a new experience at a, ummmm, *mature* age. We are also glad to see an ever-increasing number of women getting involved in the sport at our events, such as the Wortmann sisters, Shelby Cooper, Louise Coltharp, and Linda Ockner, among others.

While David Hughes's Miata pulled triple duty at the last event, this time it was Nuri Heckrotte's white MR-2 Spyder that provided a seat for at least 3 drivers – Nuri, David, and Mike Kingsland. The car took all 3 podium spots in STR, though David edged out Nuri for the win. Nuri's MR-S also took 3 of the Top 5 PAX spots! We had a number of other 2-driver cars, with friends or siblings squaring off in battles of pure driving skill.

Although George Alderman declined to bring the Prius this time, he was heard to comment that Prius sales were down 10% following the Toyota's loss to Lou Spinelli's Chevy Volt in our last event. "Electric Lou" brought the silent but swift Volt back to take second in HS behind Chris "Corner on the door handles" Maassen's Civic DX sedan.

Other noteworthy cars included Nicholas Betegh's well-sorted red 1969 911 and Robert Nyitrai's clean blue 1995 version, spreading that beautiful air-cooled flat-six sound across the course. Tim Ploechinger returned in his red Lotus Elise, and overcame some morning frustrations in the afternoon runs.

Matthew Tornetta's heavily prepared (and heavily cammed) Volvo 240 wailed around the cones, representing the station wagon fans. Dan Ritter fitted an external muffler to his side-dumped Focus, but unfortunately bottomed out and damaged the rest of the exhaust system. We hope to see him back at Dover with his radical bodywork conversion. The field was rounded out with a number of FRS/BRZ "frizbees", \$2000s, \$Ti/WRX/OBS Subarus, and many other marques and models.

Paul Alderman returned with the Aldermans' Caterham Super 7, fresh from a heart transplant after suffering an apparent rod bearing attack at an earlier event. The Caterham didn't need much recovery period, as Paul drove it to a quick 32.150 to take FTD. Paul actually posted a pair of smoking times – 31.790 and 31.791 – but coned on both of those runs. That kind of consistency is what makes for a good driver, particularly in autocross. David Hughes also posted a number of low-32 runs, all within a few hundredths or each other. David ended up trailing Paul's clean FTD by a mere tenth of a second!

PAX, as usual, wound up with a slightly different ranking. Fastest Index Time of the Day was claimed by David Hughes, driving Nuri's MR-S to an adjusted 27.032. He was followed by Brandon Hipp's S200 at 27.563 (index) and Nuri Hecktrotte with a 27.602 (index).

Our Class and PAX Championship standings are posted at the Club's website. As we head into the final event, the battle for various class championships is heating up, as well as the PAX-based Driver Of The Year. Only about 50 points separate the Top 5 PAX drivers, so it could be anybody's win after Autocross VI and the 1-event drop.

Thanks to all of our regulars and especially our volunteer staff, including tech, registration, instruction, and timing / scoring. Dedicated volunteers keep our events running smoothly. We couldn't do it without your help.

#### Secretary's Report - Jim Martin

The 4th of August, 2015 meeting was held at the Hunter's Den Restaurant. The turnout was 11 members, thanks to all that showed up. The meeting was called to order by Paul Alderman at 7:27 PM.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> (Willis Weldin) - At the end of July our finances were \$11,466.63. This dollar amount is a new high for our Club, which is a direct result of our AutoX Program. This new high accounts for the close to \$5,000 spent on new equipment.

<u>Membership Report</u> (Anita Steward) – At the end of July our membership has grown from 102 members in June to 107 members, which is a new high. Last year at this time we were at 90 members. This can be tied to our renewed focus on growing the Club. We would like to welcome Jose Marcano to both the monthly meeting and BMC; our last AutoX was also his first.

<u>AutoX Report</u> (Duke Wilford) – Our 4<sup>th</sup> AutoX for the Season resulted in 66 Drivers participating, we had a number of pre-registered who did not show. Everyone managed to get 6 runs in plus some free fun runs at the end. Last year at this time we had 49 drivers registered for the Glasgow Site. Looks like we lose a lot to summer vacations?

The Glasgow School District managed to get the fence fixed for a cost of \$565 and they were promptly reimbursed by the Club.

We are looking at the possibility of having an annual meeting to award trophies to the best PAX scores of the season. We also want to keep searching for at least one more site at least the size of Glasgow to provide variety for the attendees.

**Rally Report** (George Alderman) –

Jim Irons, Rally Master for our 3<sup>rd</sup> Rally, reported that his event will be called Dealer's Choice Rally. Participants can chose between one of two classes:
