Our last event of the season was the biggest yet, with almost 100 drivers showing out to throw their hat in the ring for the Lofland Memorial Cup! We got a bit of a slow start in the morning, but overall the event ran so smoothly that even with our largest attendance yet we were finished by 4:30P and offsite in time for dinner.

Everyone's favorite event chair (me, it's me) designed a final course that put a few tires in the air and caused some power slides that made spectators wonder if we're turning into a drift club for good! This was a course that strongly rewarded looking ahead and scanning for the next gate. My goal was to get drivers as much seat time as possible for the season finale, and with an FTD almost 10 seconds longer than our previous events, I think it worked. Much appreciation to the crew who helped set up and audit the course for safety and flow.

There were quite a few new faces under the tent and in grid this time, and everyone did a stellar job monitoring the course and communicating with the corner workers. We're really making progress building a strong core group of folks who can keep the event moving seamlessly!

Our corner workers were also outstanding – everyone paid great attention to safety, and I think I only had to remind everyone one time to get the red flags waving for hazards. You guys were also invaluable in helping us to identify where people were getting lost so that we could give them some coaching in grid.

In total, we ran 97 drivers across 25 classes with our usual 2:1 ratio of non-members to members. Even with so many drivers, things ran so well that we were able to get in our usual 6 competition runs, posting almost 600 total recorded laps.

The competition for FTD was fierce, with 3 drivers battling it out barely 2/10 of a second from each other, but Rick Newman in the brown SSM Porsche 911 finally took it home. That means he also won one of our two Lofland Memorial Cups, which will be inscribed with his name ad eternum.

Patrick Gaffney drove his space gray FS BMW M3 to its absolute limits to earn PAX champion of the day over his SS and STR competition! However, the PAX Lofland Cup is awarded a bit differently, based on season points rather than the final event. Our 2020 PAX Driver of the Year is Craig Marhefka, who finished in the top 3 PAX times at every single event this year to earn the second cup.
