BMC Meeting Highlights

The 04 January 2022 meeting was held at Deer Head Hot Dogs in Christiana, DE. Meeting was attended by 6 members, 2 of them new. Turnout was a record low. No quorum of Exec Board. Meeting called to order by Club Chair Duke at 7:15pm.

Secretary: Did not attend. Notes kept by AX Chair and transcribed by Club Chair. December Elections with one candidate for each Exec Board position. Only change is Membership Chair to Alex Brooke.

Treasurer: Did not attend. Current bank balance is ~ \$34,700.00. Incorporation fee paid for 2022 (\$44). Insurance due in March. Club is remaining with K&K Insurance, but they are switching underwriters - minimal impact expected. There are ~ \$4,000 in unused event credits with various users on MSR. About \$1,000 are from CVGP will expire at the end of 2022. Club Chair proposes to make all open credits expire at that time, and will send email alerts. Future credits will have a 1-year lifespan from date of issue.

Membership: New Membership Chair not expected to attend regular meetings due to travel distance. Two new members, Chris Pippin and Chris Devaux, attended the meeting.

Rally: Chair did not attend. First Rally event is tentatively scheduled to be the Shamrock Showdown III, around St. Patrick's Day.

Autocross: Autocross Chair presented the following information:

- •Proposed AX dates 26 March, 28 May, 23 July, 08 October, with possible alternate / extra date of 12 November. Ripken Management will send contract for signature and deposit will be required.
- •AX Chair has been in discussion with Philly SCCA concerning purchase of their old timing truck. Asking price is \$5,000 including PA system, timing computer(s), monitors, etc. BMC proposes to get a small group together to examine the truck before proceeding with negotiations. Details are needed to determine approximate yearly costs. Truck would replace current trailer. Convenient / inexpensive / secure parking location will be needed.
- •AX Chair intends to release reserved car numbers for non-members and expired members in February. Announcement will be made ahead of time.

Property: Chair did not attend.

Newsletter: Editor did not attend. Contributions for the February Gasline are due to the Editor by 27 January.

Other business:

- •Discussion of holiday party venues occurred, with preference towards north / west locations to accommodate newer members from central PA area.
 - •General discussion of other potential AX sites. Meeting was adjourned at 7:55 pm.

Automotive Batteries - Starting Cold

With cold weather upon us, our vehicle batteries are challenged with much higher current draws during a cold start due to a variety of factors, especially caused by cold engine oil being more resistant to being pumped by the oil pump.

Efficient cold startups are affected by a variety of factors. Always follow the manufacturer's owner's manual for the recommended procedure; however there may be few tips which may not be covered.

Today's fuel injected vehicles have an array of sensors to allow an engine to operate optimally as long as the fuel and engine management system are in proper working order.

When starting a cold engine, and the vehicle is started with a key, not a push button, turn the key to the on position and wait five seconds before cranking. This allows the fuel pump to prime the fuel system.

On both systems, key and push button, do not depress the gas pedal.

Do not allow the starter motor (engine cranking) to operate continuously longer than fifteen seconds. If the engine does not start, allow five to ten seconds between starting attempts to allow the starter motor to cool down.

As the starting system's efficiency is affected by other factors, such as the switching components and especially the battery cables which need to be securely fastened to the battery posts with clean connections.

Most of today's batteries are maintenance free, but if not, it's important to maintain the proper electrolyte (battery acid) level. Use distilled water to top off a battery as necessary. Only fill to 1/4" below the surface of the battery.

Keep the top of the battery clean. Baking soda and water work well. Wear protective gloves and goggles to avoid compromising your skin.

As for batteries, there are several specifications that need to be considered. If replacing a battery, always replace the battery with a battery recommended for your vehicle, though note in some instances there may be some differences in their specifications such as the reserve capacity which reflects how many minutes a battery will provide power if the charging system (alternator) fails.

When replacing a battery, assuming your vehicle is negative ground (most vehicles since the late 60's are), always remove the negative cable first and then the positive cable. On installation, install the positive cable first then the negative cable. Not only is this the safe manner, failure to follow the procedure could permanently damage electronic modules in the vehicle.

Also note that if the battery is disconnected and a memory saver is not used, every electrical preset will be erased (emissions, radio stations, etc.). Additionally, the engine control module will lose all of its adaptive memory such that the vehicle will need to be driven to readapt. On vehicles 1996 and newer the engine management "monitors" are cleared, requiring the vehicle to be driven through a manufacturer's prescribed drive cycle to reset the monitors to pass emission testing.

Lastly of vital importance, on newer vehicles it is important to determine if your vehicle requires the replacement battery to be registered to your vehicle's engine management system. This must be done with an appropriate scan tool.
