Autocross Report – Duke Wilford



The full Harvest Moon was still hanging in the sky over Dover Speedway as the ground crew was arriving on site and the trailer was working its way down from Wilmington for set up of our final autocross of the 2016

season. Saturday, 17 September was our fourth autocross at the Speedway, and our first where the weather cooperated fully. There were no monsoons, the temperature and breeze were mild, and the day mostly sunny.

All told, 77 drivers took the starter's flag, including several who ran both the autocross event and our inaugural drift event, going on concurrently. Thanks to the weather, the early start, and a fairly trouble-free day, drivers got 7 competition runs. By the time the afternoon heat was over, there had been 531 passes through the timing lights.

Our Classic Street Car class has shown increasing numbers throughout the season, and we are happy to see these historic cars getting some exercise. Paul Alderman's white Mustang and Frank Adkins's baby blue Valiant, both regulars, ran the cones with us, then headed up to Coatesville the following Saturday to race in their first annual vintage car grand prix street race. Gary Hunter brought his '66 Nova back for more, joined by Bruce Knight in his '66 GTO and Bob Leuckel in his '67 Corvette. Bill King's 1959 MGA was our oldest vehicle and sole sports car among the heavy American Iron. Keep coming back, Bill – we'll try to put you up against Phil Worrel's Midget and Mark Cozine's Giulia spyder.

In addition to Bob's classic beauty, we saw a large number of other Corvettes representing the badge well. At the other end of the spectrum, the Webers brought their X Prepared '67 and SSM '06 Corvettes. Firsttimer Anthony Carmen brought out his shiny new 2017 Gran Sport, Vette vets Scott Clapper and John Abdou both made appearances in their Street class 2006s, and the Axfords' bright yellow STU 2001 was piloted by both Sr and Jr to great effect.

The rest of the field was well covered with Miatae of various ages and prep levels, including our first ND model, driven by rookie Thomas Campbell. There were also MR2 spyders driven by Lou Montella, Jason Fetchko, and the McGowan brothers. Speaking of classics, Jim Irons made a rare appearance in his Z4, as well as Aaron Thorsgard in his own BMW roadster. But little sportsters are common at autocrosses. Less common are boxy Volvos, and we had 2 – Alex Kelleher's turbo 940 wagon did double duty, and was joined by Corry Hunter's 850 sedan. We also had not 1 but 2 police-duty Crown Vic P71s in F Street: Ross Causey's familiar grey manual-swapped patrol car was challenged by Ed Emmet's white cruiser. Paving in the middle lot has deteriorated a bit, so the course was confined to the main lot. After opening with a hard right into a short slalom, the course snaked through a series of left and right sweepers. Following the big right, a straight peppered with a few offsets let drivers get up to speed a little, before a tricky decreasing-radius turn complex brought them to the end gate. Times were in the same range as Glasgow, but speeds were higher and the lack of light poles made for a smoother, more flowing course. The field ran from the mid-40s down to the mid-30s. The Top 10 were all in the 35s or below, with the Top 5 cracking the 34-second barrier and just 0.5 seconds separating P1 from P5.

When the last runs were finished and the cars all parked, the Lofland Memorial Trophy went to Dan McGowan with a quick 34.469. This cup is awarded to the driver with the fastest raw time of the day, and has a long and distinguished history with the Club. Dan's name will be inscribed for posterity as the 2016 winner! Congratulations to Dan and Will for overcoming some mechanical issues from previous events.

In addition to the Lofland Cup autocross, BMC hosted a drift event to test a new area of motorsport for the Club. The event well, with many runs through the short drift course, many tires going up in smoke, and many wide smiles for drivers and passengers.

This column has already gotten a bit long, but I can't close out without thanking all the drivers, spectators, and volunteers who came out event after event. I'm especially grateful to those who put in the effort and don't even drive. We have a good team going and we strive to offer good value, a safe environment, and fun, competitive autocross events. Thanks to everybody who participated, helped, or even just watched.
