Most of the questions were easy, but there were a few tricky ones. A couple of the questions involved counting Black Horse and Rider signs. The obvious signs were the normal diamond-shaped caution signs erected by the State Highway Dept. However, there was one oval sign at Cloverleaf Stables that everyone missed.

The finish was at Brandywine Brewing Company in Greenville, Delaware. Everyone enjoyed the food and comparing notes. This was one of the larger turnouts we have had for a rally in quite a while. The 4th of October, 2016 meeting was held at Café Napoli. The turnout was 16 members & 3 guests; the Executive Committee had a quorum. The meeting was called to order by Club Chair, Paul Alderman at 7:02 PM.

<u>Membership Report</u> (Anita Steward) - We now have 138 members, a new record. The BMC Christmas Party was discussed. The group agreed to return to the University & Whist Club this year. The date will be Tuesday December 6th. George Alderman will coordinate details with that club.

<u>**Treasurer's Report</u>** (Richard Wortman) – Richard stated that the club is in good financial shape. He noted that sharing the Dover Autocross with the Drift Club prevented BMC from losing money on the event. Due to other customers present in the room, the BMC financial report was passed around the table.</u>

Rally Report (George Alderman) – Willis Weldin's Map & Question Rally is October 16th. It will be run in the Brandywine Valley area as in Willis' previous rallies. Dave Mitchell discussed his rally for Saturday, November 12th. It will be a 2 hour, 45-mile rally in the Cecil County/ Chester County area, ending in Fair Hill Md. It will have a Veterans theme and he suggested that BMC match entrants' donations, which would be given to a suitable military support organization. The USO and Wounded Veterans were suggested. Details to follow.

<u>AutoX Report</u> Paul reported for Duke Wilford on Autocross VI. The Drift Club of DE members discussed the success of their Dover Speedway Drift event. They would like to be an associate club with BMC, and have more events in conjunction with our autocrosses. They could draw up to 40 cars and would like to have 2 to 3 events per year. Richard Wortman pointed out that income/cost sharing events like the recent one would financially enable BMC to run more events at Dover Speedway.

Property Report (Dave Mitchell) – Dave is working on organizing the Club Trailer.

<u>Editor</u> (Jim Irons) – Did not remind everyone that all articles for the next newsletter need to be forwarded to him no later than the last Tuesday of each month.

<u>Coatesville Grand Prix</u> – Paul and the group discussed the many happenings at the recent Coatesville races. It seemed to be a success and it is hoped that they can run the races again next year.
