Checkpoints, Odometer Errors and Math Mistakes. That describes the Georgetown Jaunt Rally for me and Shawn. For those of you that enjoy my Chair Chattering, I will continue.

This past weekend we had the Georgetown Jaunt II Rally designed by rallymaster Jim Irons. (Yea Jim) I had the morning planned to get ready and pickup Shawn in Odessa and then drive to Newark for the start of the rally. The next thing I hear is my neighbor mowing his grass, so now I decided to add into the schedule a quick grass cutting, which didn't happen as quick as I wanted. After putting the mowers, weed whacker and bikes back in the shed. I need to hurry up get ready and go meet Shawn. We met at the Wawa and topped up the tank, grabbed something to eat and blasted off to Newark. We are now behind schedule and it set the tone for the day.

Problem 1, as much as I enjoy navigating, I still need to practice more to become better. Cranking the Curta (mechanical calculator) takes some practice and the more I do it the easier it becomes. The planned practice on the drive to Newark did not happen.

Problem 2, Odometer Error. The odometer measures to 1/100th of a mile, and can be zeroed for the start of the rally. That is better than the factory 66 Mustang odometer that doesn't have a trip odometer and reads only in 10ths. The problem is I have only had it working for a few rallies and I do not have a good data source to determine how close it is to true mileage. Yes, I could have used a GPS for mileage but I want to use the mechanical odometer. I would need to find our GPS to use it also. I think I need to grab it from Heather's van.

Chair Chatter – Paul Alderman

Problem 3, Math Mistakes. Jim did a nice job on the course with multiple speed changes throughout the rally. This keeps me busy writing down the mileage, and changing the factor on the Curta. At each speed change, I must adjust the minutes per mile factor. Then at each tenth of a mile, I can check the timing to see if we are early, on time, or late. A Transit Zone in a rally is a certain time to cover a specific clue or number of clues. So you must add the time and then adjust the mileage. If you are behind on the timing (See Problem 1) then you are sharing bad information. We went from ahead to behind as I sat there working back through the math and realizing my mistake. Arrghhh. We zipped through the second checkpoint 1.23 minutes behind (actually 1.66 see Problem 2) we then recovered for the last part of the rally and were feeling pretty good.

The scoring (Problem 2 again) since we had not gotten enough mileage data, we thought that our mileage wasn't that far off. Wrong again. It seems that we started with a .40 (24 second penalty) and just continued from there. Congrats to the Wilfords who ran the SOP (Seat of the Pants) class and scored a very respectable 68 (40.80 seconds) over the 40 mile drive. Thanks to all who came and ran the event, tell others about it and encourage them to come for the next one.

Autocross – Duke Wilford



Autox V, on 09 September, was an autocross / drift co-event. Autocross ran the larger, smoother front lot while the drifters put the middle lot to good use. With 57 entries and cooperative weather, we managed 7 competition runs for each driver.

The design team tried to inject some variety into the autocross course, with a boot-shaped first quadrant that crossed back over itself near the start. This lengthened the available course without resorting to a multiple-lap format. From the crossover, a serious right offset led into a 3-cone slalom along the island, followed by esses returning back toward the center. From there, a loose Chicago box exited through a series of gates to the finish line.

The 2-cone slalom in the opening quadrant, and especially the offset after the crossover, seemed to catch some drivers out on their first few runs. However, almost everybody seemed to get a handle on it eventually.

Times ranged from low 38s to the bottom half of the 50s, with most runs falling in the 40-44 second range. Competition was fierce for FTD, though no one broke into the 37s. Just 3 tenths separated the Top 5 drivers, with the 1-2-3 spread covering only 131/1000s of a second. In the end it was Alex Cabinian in his STUprepared Golf R that took the FTD honors with a 38.150 on his last run of the day.

Our final autocross event of the 2017 season is Saturday, 14 October, at Dover Speedway. This will be autocross only, utilizing both lots. Due to the preceding NASCAR weekend, the fence will be back in place, so the course area will not be quite as large as August's. However, it will be plenty big enough for a longer-thanusual layout. October's Autox VI, our season finale, is also our Lofland Memorial Cup event. This trophy honors a BMC member and car enthusiast who passed away at an early age. His family dedicated the Cup to be inscribed with the name of the driver who posts the fastest raw time at our final autocross each season. Past winners include Dan McGowan (2016), Nuri Heckrotte (2015), and Paul Alderman (2014, 2013, and other years). So come on out and try for a piece of BMC history!
