Autocross Chair - Duke Wilford



Autocross II went off without a hitch on Saturday, 08 June at Ripken Stadium. Although there was a little breeze, it was nothing like the sandblasting we got at AxI. Temperatures and cloud cover were reasonable, and course conditions were great. Parking was a bit, umm,

competitive as the facility was also hosting a youth baseball tournament, and will likely be for at least the August event as well. But we were able to minimize the course area lost to paddock, without compromising safety.

Though down a few cars from AxI's sellout, turnout was solid at 76. Non-members outnumbered drivers about 2 to 1. In total there were about 470 passes through the timing lights, with each driver getting 6 competition runs. Technical issues and on-course incidents were minimal.

The course was relatively open and fast, with a few technical spots such as a crossover near the start and an optional slalom in the last section. This element allowed drivers to pick their entry point. Going left allowed the car to carry more speed into the slalom at the cost of a more difficult exit. Going right required a slower entry speed but paid off at the far end.

Many of our BMC first-timers from AxI returned for AxII, so it seems we are doing something right. Our procedural changes seemed to make the morning go a little more smoothly:

- •Roving tech of ready cars (hood and trunk open; all preparations complete) seemed to make the task easier for both inspectors and drivers
- •Between tech changes and pre-assigned run groups, eliminating a trip back to the tent for each driver reduced crowding at the registration desk

In addition to smoothing the check-in process, preassigned run groups ensure that every car in a given class runs under similar conditions. This is a plus that makes the results more fair for all. It also eliminates crowding in the later run groups...

AxII was **David Spain's** first day as Event Deputy, and he did a great job helping with course setup and several other tasks. We're looking forward to his help again, and to training him in a variety of roles throughout the event days. Thanks for coming out, Dave!

We're at the halfway mark of our season, and overall it seems to be a positive change for the autocross program. Our next event is Saturday, 20 July, at Ripken Stadium. Preregistration is open now at:

COATESVILLE INVITATIONAL VINTAGE GRAND PRIX

The City of Coatesville PA is hosting their 4th annual Invitational Vintage Grand Prix road racing event on Saturday September 21, 2019.

There are some within our membership ranks who can remember the early days of Club racing where the courses were set on public

roads or carved out of some farmer's field. Think Watkins Glenn NY, Marlboro MD, Hershey Hill climb. You get the picture. I'm old but not quite that old. I missed that era by ... just that much. The likelihood of that era being repeated is very slim; however, this unique event will happen.

BMC is actively involved in this year's Coatesville event and we're offering an experience and bragging rights that few car guys, and car ladies, ever get a shot at. The big clubs, read SCCA, always talk about workers. BMC wants you to think about participation and the experience of being a part of what may be a historic automotive event. (The Race of Gentlemen in Wildwood NJ started the same way!)

We are asking our fellow BMC members to participate in this event by helping with the "nuts and bolts" of running it. Our club has been asked to supply pit and paddock "wranglers", organizers and guides and corner control personnel. In addition, we will control 9 corner stations where you will be able to get "up close" to cars at speed. Remember, the car is not that close and not that fast. Each corner station will need 2 or 3 people to manage the car flow and handle the flagging. Last, but not least, we will supply starter service at the start/finish line. Talk about right in the middle of the action!

Think of all the cool events you'd like to attend. Now add the benefit of being an actual participant; without the expense and marital bliss of funding a vintage race car. We need your help. We are asking for a small commitment of your time and promise to give you a great experience in return. At some point before the event we'll organize a familiarization and training meeting.
